PARTICIPANTS WILL LEARN HOW TO:

- Define the term "opioid" and list substances that are classified as opioids
- Recognize the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose
- Understand the treatment priorities for patients with suspected opioid overdose
- Understand the potential adverse effects following administration of naloxone
- Describe the safety precautions recommended for prehospital providers

TARGET AUDIENCE:

Trained emergency responders to include law enforcement officers, fire-based first responders, emergency medical services (EMS) practitioners and non-traditional licensed first responders (i.e. school nurses). *This training module is not intended for use by non-trained civilian bystanders.*

CONTINUING EDUCATION:
