By developing a system that began with a survey form and evolved over time into a web form, Sarolyn created a process that made it simple for the hospital's associates to submit their efforts into the CBISA system and set the groundwork for the comprehensive Community Benefit Flow Chart, drastically improving the efficiency and accuracy of reporting this vital contributions.
